## Dress Code & Cell Phone Policy

#### What to Wear?



**Dresses/Skirts** 

Knee length or longer

No sleeveless dresses





Shirts

- No tank tops
- Must cover your undergarments
- No off the shoulder shirts
- No crop tops
- No see-through clothing



#### **Shorts**

- Must be worn at the waist
- Must be mid-thigh in the front and sides
- No undergarments visible









**Pants** 

- Must be worn at the waist at all times. No sagging
- NO holes above the knee, without material sewn inside the pants.
- Leggings MUST be worn with a shirt or dress that comes to your fingertips and completely covers your front and back.











## No PJ's, bedroom slippers, hats, or hoodies on head inside the building!



#### **Avoid T-shirts That...**

- Display obscene words, pictures or designs, any article which conveys a sexually suggestive, vulgar, demeaning or inflammatory remark
- A pro-alcohol message, a tobacco and or drug related message, or is symbolic of gangs or disruptive groups.

#### Costumes???

• Are permitted for specific school activities but they too must follow dress code rules.





### Jewelry

• Jewelry (including piercings) that creates a hazardous condition (studded bracelets, necklaces, oversized earrings, etc.) should not be

worn to school.



#### P.S.

• Principals can always change the dress code as new styles/issues come about. If they interfere with education they will probably not be allowed.



# Consequences for Dress Code Violations:

- Call home for more clothes.
- Wait in TOR until different clothes arrive.
- Repeat offenders are subject to further disciplinary action as deemed appropriate by the principal/designee. (see the written page)



### Cell Phone Policy



- No cell phones or electronic devices (including earbuds or headphones) should be visible while in the hallway
- Cell phones are allowed during outside break and in the lunchroom.
- Cell phones are not allowed in the gym or out in the PE field. This is considered a classroom. Cell phones should be turned off and in the student's bookbag.
- Once students are inside of the school building (at or after 7:05 am), no cell phones are allowed to be out and visible.
- Cell phones should be turned off before entering the classroom

Taking Photos, Recording and/or Posting Content to Social Media or sharing with other people in any way (texting, email, showing to others etc.:

The use of cell phones to record, photograph or post content is not approved outside educational purposes.

 This is a Level II Offense, which could cause a student to receive up to 9 days in Alternative School.

Any content that goes against State and Federal Laws and will be turned over to law enforcement.

Harassment, threats, inappropriate content etc.





Absolutely no phone or other electronic device should be in a student's possession during state testing.

The phone or electronic device will be taken up and the parent/guardian will be required to come pick up the phone or electronic device.

# Consequences for Cell Phone Policy:

- 1st offense Warning and parent contact
- 2nd offense 1 day of before or after school detention
- 3rd offense 3 days of TOR
- 4th offense- Superintendent probation
- 5th offense- 5 days of alternative school
- 6th offense-disciplinary hearing to determine no less than 10 and no more than 45 days of alternative school
